Maharshi Dayanand University, Initially known as Rohtak University, Rohtak, was established by an Act of Legislature of Haryana in 1976 with the objective to promote and life sciences. Initially it was a unitary and residential University, but in November 1978, its character was changed and it became an affiliating University. Through an amendment in the Act in 1977, it was named after the great revolutionary and social reformer, Maharshi Dayanand and came to be known as Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak. The University Grants Commission recognized this University under section 2(f) for the recognition of degrees and under section 12(b) of the University Grants Commission Act for central grants on Feb. 23, 1983. University Sports Department is on the path to achieve excellence in sports activities. Sports Department possesses excellent infrastructure facilities which include a modern indoor Gymnasium Hall for all Indoor activities, an international standard size Swimming Pool, Squash Court, Athletic track and a sprawling sports complex which has all playfields for the university students. Every year sports department organizes about 60 inter-college tournaments for men and women players of the colleges affiliated to M. D. University, Rohtak. Sports department organizes coaching camps and sends the teams for Inter-university participation. During the year 2010-11 the MDU Sports Council, Rohtak organized. 54 inter college tournaments in Men & Women sections respectively 29 Men section and 25 for women section. The university sent 50 teams for north zone/ north east zone/All India Inter University tournaments. Prior to participation in the Inter University tournaments, the coaching camps for all the teams were conducted. In addition to this we so organized the Hockey (Women) North East Zone & All India Inter University & Baseball (Men & women) All India inter University Tournaments in which our University teams secured First positions. During the Year 2011-12 MDUSC organized 62 inter College-tournaments. 56 Teams were sent for participation in the North Zone/North East Zone and all India Inter University Tournaments. All the Coaching Camps were organized prior to participation in the Inter University tournaments. In addition to this our university organized AllU cross country (Men& women), North Zone Football Women, North Zone Hockey Women and All Inter University Korfbal Championships, During the Year 2012-13 MDUSE organized 60 Inter College tournaments. 56 Teams were sent for participation in the North Zone/ North East Zone and All India Inter University Tournaments. All the Coaching Camps were organized prior to participation in the Inter University tournaments. In addition to this our university

organized North Zone and AllU Badminton (Men & women) & North Zone Kabaddi (Men) Tournaments. The achievements attained by University players in various corners of the country as well as world. This is all because of an untiring efforts of the officials, Coaches and department of sports connected with their practice, coaching and arrangements, encouragement from the Principal and Lecturers Physical Education of the affiliated colleges, full cooperation of the University Authorities, Haryana Sports Department, provost Girls Hostel and Wardens of the Girls Hostel and Media.

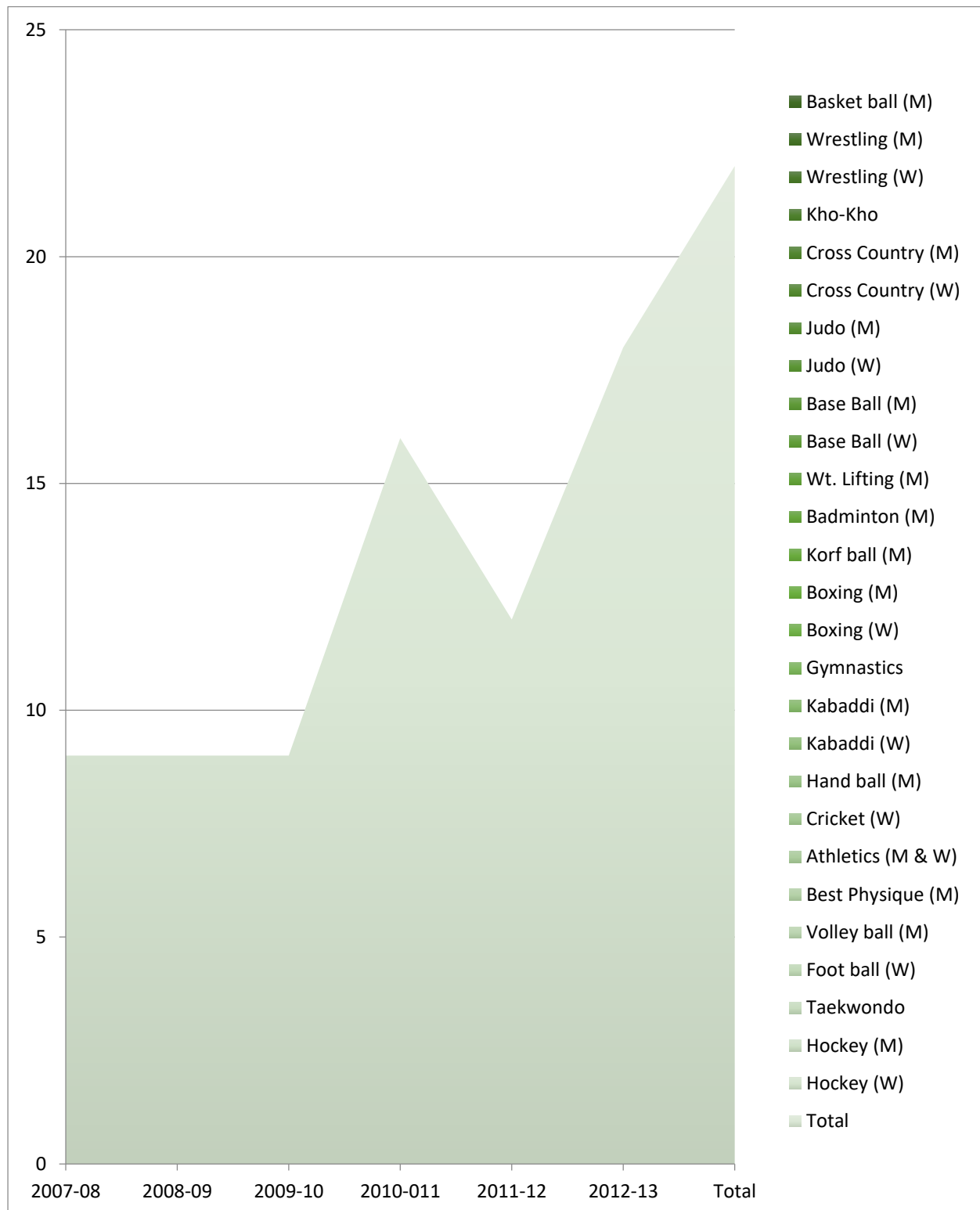
